## **WORKSHOP DESCRIPTION**

In the era of expanding gambling, providers are encouraged to build their base of knowledge in order to provide service and support. The goal of this training is to increase current social service providers' skills in clinical interventions, addictions treatment and case management for people experiencing gambling disorders. Social service providers will learn how to incorporate problem gambling information and treatment skills into their practices.
